- She fought for Women's Suffrage.





- Nzingha resisted Portuguese invasion and slave raids for 30 years.





- He was an important figure in the Harlem Renaissance due to his contributions.






- I was the ninth Mansa of the Mali Empire, one of the most powerful West African states.

- After leading a successful pilgrimage across the Sahara, he won international prestige for Mali as one of the world's largest and wealthiest empires.





- His life and legacy is remembered as one of the most important in American history.







- Angelou have the first nonfiction bestseller by an African American woman.




